

## Virtual Dermatology Experience at UNM Dermatology

Note: This experience is not for academic credit or meant to replace a clinical Dermatology rotation.

Session dates:

1. 9/14/2020- 9/25/2020 (10 a.m. – 11 a.m. MST Monday-Friday)
2. 9/28/2020 – 10/9/2020 (10 a.m. – 11 a.m. MST Monday-Friday)

Time: 10 a.m. – 11 a.m. MST Monday-Friday with additional optional didactics

Enrollment limit: 6 students per session

Not offered for credit

### Description and requirements

All activities take place virtually/by Zoom. This experience is problem-oriented in approach and emphasizes the diagnosis and treatment of the most common skin diseases and the cutaneous manifestations of systemic diseases. Students accepted to participate will acquire some proficiency in the rapid diagnosis and basic treatment of the most important diseases of the skin. Students are expected to actively participate during the sessions.

Students are expected to attend a one-hour case session with a Dermatology faculty member at 10 a.m. MST each Monday-Friday. Topics will cover: general dermatology, cutaneous oncology, and pediatric dermatology. Each case session incorporates 10 minutes of didactic and 50 minutes of cases.

On their second/final Friday, students will give a five-minute presentation to the dermatology faculty on a topic of their choice.

### Format

Director: Dr John Durkin, MD, FAAD

Required: 5 hours of case sessions per week. Each lecture is offered at 10 a.m. MST Monday-Friday.

Optional (information/schedule will be available prior):

- Resident didactics Wednesday afternoon (1 p.m. – 4 p.m. MST)
- Resident didactics Friday morning (9 am – 12 pm MST)
- Grand Rounds/Journal Club (8 a.m. – 9 or 10 am. MST).

Students are encouraged and invited to attend all didactics sessions. Students who wish to apply to residency in the UNM Department of Dermatology are encouraged to apply.

### Application materials required

- Statement of interest (500 word max). Please include any connection to UNM, the Southwest, New Mexico or Albuquerque.

- Ranking of your session preference (#1, #2, no preference).
- CV
- Step 1 scores (Minimum score of 225 preferred, but applications will be holistically reviewed); you may include this in your CV.
- Photo (optional for application but required if you are accepted)
