



AAD Good Skin Knowledge Community Grant Applications Open Through March 31, 2023

The AAD Good Skin Knowledge Community Grant is open to community groups, schools, and after school programs to help deliver a four-module lesson plan training to children ages 8-13 within their organization. *Please note that the community organization must apply for the grant and that the money will be provided to the organization directly.* As a medical student, you are welcome to assist them with their application.

Good Skin Knowledge is the American Academy of Dermatology's youth education campaign. The goal is to teach young people the facts about common skin, hair, and nail conditions. Understanding skin, hair and nail conditions can help children build self-esteem and compassion for others.

The AAD will offer community grants up to \$600 to non-profit and community-based organizations in underserved populations in order to provide the opportunity to deliver Good Skin Knowledge lesson plan training to children ages 8-13 in their community. Learn if your organization is eligible to apply. Applications are open through March 31, 2023.

The following criteria must be met to secure a grant:

- Grantee must be a community organization in an underserved area.
- Signed waivers/consent forms from all participants must be submitted to AAD.
- Signed letter of agreement must be submitted along with W-9 forms for the organization.
- Total trained children must be submitted via summary form after event(s).
- All supplies for STEM (Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) activities must be purchased by the grantee and available for use during training sessions with students.
- All four session modules must be covered: the skin, acne, sun safety and plants and bugs.
- Pre and post educational surveys must be administered to groups.
- Training must be delivered by December 31, 2023.
